The Special Collection will be jointly edited by the past and present Editors of the journal: Jakub Bijak, Griffith Feeney, Nico Keilman and Carl Schmertmann.

We invite submissions in two categories:

- Personal reflections (up to 500 words) on Jim's legacy. We envisage that these reflections from many contributors would be combined into a single Reflection article in Jim's honour

The timetable and process for submissions is as follows:

15 October 2022: For **scientific papers**, please register interest by sending a 250-word abstract,

structured according to the Demographic Research template (Background, Objective,

Methods, Results, Conclusions, Contribution) to the Editorial Office

(office@demographic-research.org). We would like to ask authors to explain the connection (which may be loose) between their proposed paper and Jim's work, for

example in the Contribution section of the Abstract.

For **personal reflections**, please register interest by sending a short email outlining

your intended contribution by the same deadline.

15 November 2022: After initial screening, the Editors will invite a selection of papers to submit full

manuscripts. Please note that not all papers will be invited, and the Editors reserve the right to reject submissions that, in their view, are too narrow, incremental, do not fit the

scope of the journal or collection.

The personal reflections will only undergo light-touch editing, but the Editors reserve

the right not to publish any material deemed irrelevant or inappropriate.

28 February 2023: Deadline for full manuscripts. The **scientific papers** need to be submitted via the

journal's submission portal on www.demographic-research.org. Personal reflections

are to be sent as an email attachment to the Editorial Office at

office@demographic-research.org

Summer 2023: Tentative date for the Special Collection being finalised and an Editorial published. The

exact timetable will depend on the speed of the review process. In line with our editorial practice, individual papers will be published as soon as they are approved by

the reviewers and accepted by the Editors.
